Symposium Agenda

The change over the past two decades from an international system based on independent nation states to an interdependent world facing global challenges has been widely explored and analyzed. This shift has placed a higher priority on nation states working closely with one another and pursuing sustainable multilateral approaches to tackling global and regional challenges. The International Symposium 2010 will build on the foundation of these discussions by exploring the challenges that lie ahead and the complex

relationship between culture, international relations, and globalization over the next two decades.

This year's Symposium will be split into three complementary parts. The program will begin by looking in greater detail at "culture" and "identity" and how these terms are used and understood today (23rd – 25th May). The second part of the program will build on these components by considering the role that culture plays in contemporary international relations and the process of globalization (26th – 27th May). The final part of the program, "Understanding Afghanistan: Supporting Democracy and Development in Afghanistan - The Path Ahead", held in cooperation with the North Atlantic Treaty Organisation (NATO), will apply these discussions to one of the key issues that will determine global politics over the coming years – Afghanistan and stability in Central Asia and will focus on democracy and development in Afghanistan (28th- 30th May).
