INTRODUCTION

The Taiwan Scholarships & Fellowships (TAFS) program is a Republic of China (R.O.C.) government initiative aimed to promote knowledge, educational links and enduring friendships between Taiwan and the global community.

Offered by five ministries and agencies in Taipei, the TAFS comprises nine awards in three categories: the Fellowships, the Huayu (Mandarin) Enrichment Scholarships, and the Scholarships for Degree. All together, approximately 1,250 grants are provided annually for undergraduate and postgraduate students as well as researchers across the world to study or to conduct advanced research in Taiwan.

MOFA Huayu (Mandarin) Enrichment Scholarship

The Ministry of Foreign Affairs (MOFA) established the MOFA Huayu (Mandarin) Enrichment Scholarship (MOFA HES) in 2010 to enhance bilateral exchanges and friendships with Taiwan's diplomatic allies by encouraging students from these countries to study Mandarin in Taiwan and to deepen their understanding of the local Taiwanese culture.

1. Financial assistance

- (1) A monthly stipend of NT\$25,000.
- (2) One round-trip, economy-class ticket for the most direct route to Taiwan.
- (3) Duration: six to 12 months.

2. Eligibility

Each applicant shall:

- be of age 18 or older; possess a high school diploma or higher; have performed well at his/her most recent academic institution and be of good moral character.
- (2) be neither a Taiwanese national, nor an overseas Taiwanese compatriot.
- (3) be neither currently enrolled in a Mandarin training center nor in a full-time degree program at any university or college in Taiwan.
- (4) not be an exchange student through an academic cooperation agreement between an overseas university/college and an educational institute in Taiwan.
- (5) have never received any financial assistance under this or any other Taiwan scholarship program (offered by MOFA, MOE, MOEA, or NSC).

Recipients cannot accept any other R.O.C. government-sponsored scholarships or subsidies.

MOE Huayu Enrichment Scholarship

The Ministry of Education (MOE) established the MOE Huayu Enrichment Scholarship (MOE HES) to enhance exchanges between the Republic of China (Taiwan) and countries designated by the MOE by encouraging foreign students to study Mandarin in Taiwan and to deepen their understanding of Taiwan's cultural and social developments.

1. Financial assistance

- (1) A monthly stipend of NT\$25,000.
- (2) Duration: two months (summer courses), three months, six months, nine months, or 12 months.

2. Eligibility

Each applicant shall:

- be of age 18 or older; possess a high school diploma or higher; have performed well at his/her most recent academic institution and be of good moral character.
- (2) be neither a Taiwanese national, nor an overseas Taiwanese compatriot.
- (3) be neither currently enrolled in a Mandarin training center nor in a full-time degree program at any university or college in Taiwan.
- (4) have never received any financial assistance under this or any other Taiwan Scholarship program (offered by MOFA, MOE, MOEA, and NSC).
- (5) not be an exchange student through an academic cooperation agreement between an overseas university/college and an educational institute in Taiwan.

- (2) be neither a Taiwanese national, nor an overseas Taiwanese compatriot.
- (3) have never enrolled in any educational institution in Taiwan for the same level of degree as the current application.
- (4) not be an exchange student through an academic cooperation agreement between an overseas university/college and an educational institute in Taiwan.
- (5) have no record for being revoked a MOFA Scholarship program or other government-sponsored scholarship.

Recipients cannot accept any other R.O.C. government-sponsored scholarships or subsidies.

TaiwanICDF International Higher Education Scholarship Program

To help partner countries cultivate skilled professionals who have an international outlook, the International Cooperation and Development Fund (TaiwanICDF) works with prestigeous universitites in Taiwan to select students to receive full scholarships for undergraduate and postgraduate programs taught in English.

1. Financial asisstance

- (1) A monthly stipend of NT\$12,000 for undergraduate students, NT\$15,000 for master's students and NT\$17,000 for doctoral students. Expenses, such as tuition, textbooks, room and board, medical and accident insurance will be taken care of by the host school and the TaiwanICDF throughout the program.

Taiwan Fellowship

The Taiwan Fellowship was established by the Ministry of Foreign Affairs (MOFA) to award foreign experts and scholars interested in studies related to Taiwan, cross-strait relations, Asia-Pacific affairs and Chinese studies to conduct advanced research at universities or other academic institutions in Taiwan, thereby promoting international partnerships and mutual understanding.

1. Financial assistance

- (1) Monthly grants are paid at the beginning of every month,
 - a. Professors, associate professors, research fellows, or associate research fellows: NT\$60,000.
 - Assistant professors, assistant research fellows, or doctoral candidates: NT\$50,000.
- (2) One round-trip, economy-class ticket for the most direct route to Taiwan (not applicable to those already doing research in Taiwan. The subsidy ceiling will be decided by MOFA in accordance with the relevant regulations).
- (3) The terms of fellowship are three to 12 months.
- (4) Accident insurance for NT\$1 million.

2. Selection as a Fellow

Recipients should be foreign professors, associate professors, assistant professors, doctoral candidates, or same-level research fellows at academic institutions abroad who specialize in research in the social sciences on topics such as Taiwan, cross-strait relations, mainland China, the Asia Pacific, or other aspects of Chinese studies.

MOE Short Term Research Award

The Ministry of Education (MOE) created this award to encourage individuals from foreign countries (excluding mainland China, Hong Kong and Macau) to undertake short-term research in Taiwan, in the hopes of enhancing their understanding of Taiwanese culture and society, and of promoting exchanges and cooperation between Taiwan and other countries.

1. Financial assistance

- (1) Monthly grant of NT\$25,000.
- (2) One round-trip, economy-class ticket for the most direct flight to Taiwan
- (3) The terms of fellowship are two to six months.

2. Eligibility

Research topics should be related to Taiwan's humanities, social sciences, culture, arts and relevant comparative research (excluding areas relating to science, medicine, engineering, and relevant comparative studies).

Each applicant shall:

- (1) be a doctoral candidate from an overseas university or a postdoctoral research fellow.
- (2) be under 45 years of age.
- (3) be neither a Taiwanese national, nor an overseas Taiwanese compatriot.
- (4) not already be residing, studying (including internships), teaching or doing research in Taiwan.
- (5) not have received this award within the last five years.
- (6) not be a recipient of any other R.O.C. government-sponsored scholarship or subsidy.
- (7) not be an exchange student while receiving this award.
